1. Expert Sessions:

He discussed the various factors that lead to substance abuse and highlighted the importance of early intervention and support systems. His session included real-life case studies and statistical data to provide a comprehensive understanding of the issue.
- Or. Rafia: Dr. Rafia's session focused on the role of clinical psychologists in the rehabilitation of drug addicts. She shared her experiences working with MSF (Doctors Without Borders) and discussed various therapeutic approaches used in treating drug dependency. Dr. Rafia also conducted an interactive segment, answering questions from the students and teaching staff, and providing practical advice on how to support individuals struggling with addiction.

2. Interactive Activities:

 The event featured several interactive activities, including group discussions, role-plays, and a postermaking competition. These activities were designed to engage the students and encourage them to think critically about the impact of drug abuse on individuals and society.

3. Awareness Campaign:

 An awareness campaign was launched as part of the event, with students and teaching staff distributing informational pamphlets and displaying posters around the campus.
